***TUITION AND FEES FOR FALL SEMESTER**

The cost of tuition and fees for the BISP-L&S program for the Fall semester is distributed as follows:

International Application Fee

\$200 Paid at the same time as the online application submission

Course Application Fee

\$125 Billed after application, due approximately one month prior to beginning of instruction Health Insurance Fee \$700 Billed after application, due approximately one month prior to beginning of instruction Tuition \$750 per unit Billed during the 5th week of instruction Student Services Fee (Cal 1 Card Fee) \$250 Billed during the 5th week of instruction Lab fee (if applicable) \$100 per lab course Billed during the 5th week of instruction (only required for students taking courses with a lab component) TOTAL: \$10,275 - \$13,275

All fees are to be paid online when the student receives an invoice from UC Berkeley Extension.

Fees include: Courses Visa support Housing advice and support Orientation to Berkeley Social and cultural integration activities International student fee Mandatory U.S. medical insurance Personal academic advising Tutoring and student learning center resources Academic transcript

Cost does not include visa fees, textbooks, supplies, travel and housing costs, meals, or daily expenses.

Estimated living expenses for the Fall 2019 semester is \$10,500. The UC Extension International Student Services Office will not issue Visa papers before the student has a guarantee of at least \$20,575 in financial support for the semester.

**CLASSES

Depending on what year the students will be in when they come, many of our students take one of the CS 61 courses (61A, 61B, or 61C), even if they have already taken some of the material back home, as we teach the material in much different ways. Students can take the upper division (100 - 199) courses if they have already completed the equivalent prerequisites. All of the CS courses require knowledge of at least programming language, though if students don't have that they can start with CS 10 and one of the CS 9 courses for learning the language.

In addition to courses in CS, our computer science students also take courses from mathematics, statistics, physics, and other related departments, so there are many options to select from.

*** CALENDAR

March/April/May/June (Dates vary by university) – Students will be interviewed individually by Skype or other online means, to assess both English Language skills, as well as adequate fit for the BISP program. There are many departments to select courses from in BISP, but there are also certain departments that are not participating, so we need to ensure that students understand these limitations and can find courses they are interested in. After completing the interview, the official invitation letter will be sent within 48 hours. Date varies – BISP-LS deadline to complete and send the UC Berkeley Extension International Concurrent Enrollment Application online is two weeks

after receiving the invitation letter. If additional time is needed, please contact us to let us know. IMPORTANT: Once UC Berkeley Extension receives your application, they will send you updates by email. You should enter an email address that you checked frequently onto your application. Once your application is processed, an acceptance packet will be sent to you or your international coordinator, at the address you listed on your application, by FedEx within 3-4 weeks after receipt of your application.

June/July/August - Check for emails from Jenny Cornet-Carrillo or Rachel Marquez or BISPinSoc with important information. Please save our program email addresses BISPinSoc@berkeley.edu or bisp@berkeley.edu in your email contact list, so that our emails do not go into a spam folder.

Late July/Early August - UC Berkeley Extension enrollment system is available online for you to set up your account and apply for courses. An email with step-by-step instructions on how to set up your account will be sent to you. We recommend setting up your account and applying for at least 4 of your courses, and at least 2 alternate courses, when you receive the instruction email. ALL BISP STUDENTS MUST BE IN BERKELEY BY AUGUST 21, 2019. If you are unable to be in Berkeley by this date, you may wish to defer your participation to a later semester.

August TBA – **Mandatory** orientation for UC Extension. Exact date and time to be announced at a later date.

August TBA – Mandatory orientation for BISP. Exact date and time to be announced at a later date.

August 28 – Classes begin. All Monday-Wednesday-Friday classes meet for the first time on Wednesday August 28, and all Tuesday-Thursday classes meet for the first time on Thursday August 29. Classes that meet only one day a week, meet for the first time on that day once classes begin.

September 20 – Deadline for BISP-LS students to alter their course schedule. Students usually know what courses they want to take by the end of the second or the third week of the semester, and we recommend completing your enrollment then.

December 16-20 – Final exams are during this week. You should not plan to leave Berkeley until your exams are complete.

****Documents à fournir

If you are nominated, please obtain the following documents:

□ A copy of your valid passport. (Use a scanner. Do not take a photo of it). o If you do not have a passport, you should apply for it as soon as possible.

□ A financial statement or a Certification of Deposit that shows you have the equivalent of at least \$20,575 USD in your/your parent's bank. If you decide to get a Certification of Deposit, you will only need to freeze your money until August 1st.

□ You will need a valid credit card (VISA or Master Card) by the time you fill out the UC Berkeley Extension application. o Your credit card needs to have at least \$200.00 - You may use your parent's or a family member's credit card.
