The University:

History:

London Metropolitan University has a rich history with strong educational roots dating back to 1848

The University as it is today was created in 2002 with the merging of London Guildhall University and the University of North London, the first merger between two universities in the UK. Its roots, however, lie firmly in the nineteenth century with the establishment of the Metropolitan Evening Classes for Young Men in 1848.

In 1848 the then Bishop of London called upon the clergy to set up evening classes to improve the "moral, intellectual and spiritual condition of young men in the metropolis". The Metropolitan Evening Classes for Young Men was thus born and later became the City of London College and then the City of London Polytechnic. In 1992, it was awarded university status and adopted the name London Guildhall University.

2002 London Guildhall University merges with the University of North London on 1 August to form London Metropolitan University. This is the first merger between two universities in the UK.

2003 A ceremony is held at Mansion House in the City of London, attended by the Patron, to launch the University. The Duke of Edinburgh, the then Patron, is awarded London Metropolitan University's first degree.

2004 Two new buildings opened: the Graduate School, designed by Daniel Libeskind, and the Goulston Street building, designed for the teaching of law courses. Work begins on the science block.

2006 New Science Centre opens containing the largest and most advanced science teaching facility in Europe. It includes a Super Lab with 280 individual workstations and an international quality basketball court made from recycled aircraft tyres.

2008 London Met becomes a London 2012 Pre-Games training facility. His Holiness the 14th Dalai Lama is awarded an Honorary Doctorate in Philosophy.

We had a total of 9,618 UK-based higher education students in 2018–19, of which:

81% were studying full-time / 19% were studying part-time

147 distinct nationalities were represented

17% had a known disability

76% were undergraduate / 24% were postgraduate

Our business incubator Accelerator supports companies who have generated a combined revenue of £21 million in a single year.

Our alumni include Mayor of London Sadiq Khan, comedian Vic Reeves, singer Sinead O'Connor, Cobra Beer founder Lord Bilimoria and actress Daniela Ruah who stars in NCIS: Los Angeles and obtained a first-class degree in Performing Arts from London Met.

We have a pair of nesting peregrine falcons on our roof who hatch chicks every year and we have a webcam set up to keep an eye on them (when it doesn't get covered in feathers!) We also have a duck who visits every year to have her babies in our duckpond (complete with duck houses!) and we have two beehives on our roof (away from the falcons). 	All study abroad students from around the world are gathered for an induction that covers everything they will need to know about the university, how the classes work, how to submit work, academic guidelines, where to eat, health and safety, student activities, life and transport in London and so on. We have guest speakers from the Business School and from the Library Service. We send the students to a sport and gym induction and offer them a local, guided walk. We have a buffet and also send them on a half day tour of London with a boat trip on the Thames included. There are also activities put on by the Student Union such as karaoke, film and pizza night and quizzes.
Application process:	Students are nominated by their international office by emailing studyinlondon@londonmet.ac.uk with the students' names, email addresses and the semester of study. London Met will then email the students with the application instructions. Currently, they have to fill in the Gecko form on our study abroad website with their personal details and module selection and attach a copy of the details page of their passport, transcript of results, Bachelor certificate if they are applying for Masters level modules, and proof of their English language ability. We do not expect them to pay for expensive tests like IELTS and will accept tests like DAAD, Cambridge, Institutional TOEFL or a letter from their university testifying that their level is comparable to IELTS 6.0. https://www.londonmet.ac.uk/international/study-abroad/incoming-students/study-abroad-programme/

Credit and grading system:	Transcripts are issued showing the percentages attained in each module and whether the module has been passed or failed. The undergraduate pass mark is 40% and the postgraduate pass mark is 50%. Both London Met and ECTS credits are shown. Undergraduate, one semester modules are worth 15 London Met credits (7.5 ECTS) and postgraduate modules, which are all one semester long, are normally worth 20 London Met credits (10 ECTS).

Programme of study	Undergraduate students take 4 modules per semester for a set tuition fee which would give them 30 ECTS if all are passed. The first and second year classes tend to be three hours long and the third year classes are normally two hours long. Most modules are divided into a large lecture for an hour/90 minutes plus smaller seminar groups for the remainder of the time. The smaller groups are where presentations are held or group work done. Postgraduate students are free to choose whether they take one, two or three modules and they pay per module, the prices differ slightly depending on the school/course. Each postgraduate module is normally worth 10 ECTS. At both undergraduate and postgraduate level, modules can be chosen from different courses, depending on the requirements of the home course of study, as long as the student has the background knowledge.
	 There are some modules that are off limits: Most art and design courses will only allow art students that have submitted a portfolio Some Social Work and Early Years Teaching modules require a police vetting check and so do not accept study abroad students Undergraduates cannot take postgraduate modules Students coming for a semester cannot take year-long modules

	Some Theatre modules are off limits and some may require an audition

	We currently have an allocation of rooms at a local student hall of residence, 10 minutes' walk from our Holloway campus, and all study abroad students will be offered a place there. They are also free to look for their own accommodation. Our rooms are single occupancy, two bathrooms are shared in an apartment between 6 students who also share the kitchen. The cost is £4218 for either semester which is payable to London Met before moving in.
Tuition fees:	Our study abroad tuition fee for one semester is £6072 for the 21/22 academic year. This is a universal fee and does not differentiate between EU and non-EU students. However, in recognition of the potentially off-putting rise in fees to EU students, London Met will give discounts to its European partners as follows:
	21/22 academic year – 30% discount 22/23 academic year – 20% discount 23/24 academic year – 10% discount (1-9 students) 12% (10-19 students) 15% (20+ students)
	The discounts apply to both undergraduate and postgraduate study and the volume-based discounts in 23/24 onwards relate to all students from an institution, regardless of campus.
	Postgraduate tuition fees are charged per module taken and the cost can be seen on the course page from which the module is taken, under part-time in the fees box.
Internships:	Internships are now offered for credit at London Met. The internship module replaces one of the four undergraduate academic modules and is worth equal credit (7.5 ECTS). The Work-Based Learning team will assist students in their search for a suitable internship which the student will have to apply and interview for. The internship will run for 6 weeks in a semester and will account for 70 hours. Running alongside will be careers advice and training with reflective workshops and reports to be completed. The cost of the internship is £700 in addition to the tuition fee and students will have to supply a curriculum vitae and a cover letter.
	It should be noted that a Student visa will be required for a student of any nationality participating in an internship (unless a British passport is held) and the cost of this is currently £348. A student staying in the UK for less than 6 months will not be required to pay the Health Surcharge.
Visas and healthcare:	Following the overhaul of the UK immigration system, a citizen of any country not on the <u>visa</u> <u>national list</u> can enter the UK as a Visitor with up to 6 months leave. The purpose of the visit can be for tourism or study but work (including internships and volunteering) is not allowed. Non visa nationals can just enter the UK with their passport (not national identity card) and 6 months leave will be granted with no additional paperwork required.
	Visa nationals must apply for entry clearance in advance of coming to the UK; this involves an appointment at a visa centre, costs £95 and must be done within 3 months of the course start date. Again, work is not allowed and there are no healthcare benefits.
	Visitors to the UK from an EU country who fall ill or have a medical emergency during a temporary stay in England can use a valid European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) issued by their home country to access healthcare. An EHIC is not an alternative to travel insurance and we always advise that visitors should have both when travelling to the UK. An EHIC will not cover any private medical healthcare, being flown back home, or lost or stolen property.

Visitors to the UK from Norway will be able to access medically necessary care in the UK by presenting a valid Norwegian passport.

Visitors from Iceland, Liechtenstein and Switzerland who fall ill or have a medical emergency during a temporary stay in England may have to pay for NHS healthcare. Any treatment that has to be paid for will be charged at 150% of the national NHS rate.
